From the Interim Pastor—Living in Easter

First, I want to thank all of you for your prayers and letters and messages, phone calls and visits – all expressing your love and prayers for my recovery. There are not words that can tell how uplifting this has been to me and Peggy. As I write this, I am two days home from ten days in the hospital, feeling better every day. An old Pastor friend once told me God puts you on your back so you have to look up! And so it has been.

I somehow feel guilty for my not being there for you these past weeks. I tried but I just couldn't do it. My thanks go to Pastor Schmidt for taking over the services in my absence. I am planning, if health continues to improve, to conduct the midweek Lent services on April 1, and then Palm Sunday and Holy Week. By that time we will know if Pastor Kress is coming to us.

What an exciting time for us at Redeemer! Yet we are still in the deep dark purple of Lent with Passion Week looming up in front. Its darkest Day: Good Friday, as I strain to peer ahead, almost obliterating the Glory of the Sonrise that is the second Sunday in April: Easter!!

Our Lenten Series, *The Body of Christ* is drawing us closer and more personally to our Savior, the God/Man Jesus of Nazareth and the Second Person of the Trinity. We are called to watch and to behold the movement of our God's Son toward the cross. Such watching takes us to our knees. Our sins required the pure and innocent Son of God to walk toward Jerusalem. To watch means that our thoughts will be reordered. What appears to human eyes to be repulsive and repugnant becomes to us the very means of God's mission...

God's mission in Christ is graphic and real It is not sentimental. It is not pretty. It is not religiously correct as contemporary American religiosity defines correctness. The happy smiles, the giddy gazes, the self-absorption are taken from us.

As we watch, we know our emptiness. Here is suffering on our behalf, for our sake, and at the cost of God's own Son. Here is a bloody and sacrificial mission, for God's Son is now our sacrificial Lamb. The holiness and righteousness of God could not abide our sinful presence. But now the blood of the Lamb has purified us for God's presence.

Yes, the solemn Lenten walk with our Lord to the Cross is necessary if the Resurrection is to have any real meaning for us! If Christ had not risen, it would clearly show that His suffering and death had not been sufficient. But now Christ is risen, and this is conclusive evidence that the Father accepted the sacrifice of His Son for the reconciliation of the world. "He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification" (Romans 4:25).

The resurrection of Jesus Christ does not make us just before God for the redemption was finished on the cross,



but the resurrection proves to us that by His suffering and death Christ really did atone for our iniquities.

The resurrection of Christ proves that there is such a thing as a resurrection of the dead as Scripture says, "Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man" (1st Corinthians 15:20-21). And the resurrection proves that for believers there is a resurrection unto life as Jesus says, "I am the resurrection and the Life. He who believes in Me will live, even though He dies (John 11:25-26).

Easter! What a wonderful celebration of freedom! We are truly "redeemed from all sin, death, and from the power of the devil" as the Small Catechism states in the answer to question 134. And in question 136 it says, "Through His suffering, death, and resurrection, Christ has overcome death. Since He now gives me eternal life I need not fear death!!!"

Easter! Easter!. The month of April is bathed in the glorious light of Easter! The Alleluia's are back! Divine Service comes alive with all of Christendom singing the praises of Him who was dead, but is alive! Every believer rejoices over the Resurrection! This is the very reason we worship on Sunday!

But, there is some sadness for me in this month of April. My job with you that started last May will soon be done. Probably this will be my last Newsletter. Oh, I am thrilled at the Spirit you have displayed and the joy in worship you have shown. I thank God for bringing us all back together as a loving family.

What a wonderful family you are! We will remember fondly the good times we've shared together – the special greetings before Worship as some of you returned "home where you belong" – the Advent and Lenten Suppers – Ladies Guild - the Yard Sale – the Boards and Committees, and all the many good works you do in the Kingdom. We will miss our wonderful children and youth. Each one of you is precious to the Lord and to us. We truly love you and will never forget you!. We plan to visit frequently, but if we don't see you again this side of heaven, we will see you there where we'll finally have time.

I am confident that your Victorious and Risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will soon bring to you your new Pastor who will help you all keep on <u>LIVING IN EASTER</u> together, here at Redeemer.


As we complete the Easter Season this month, let us be thankful for all our blessings, both as a congregation and personally.


2009 Church Actual vs. Budget Year to Date Through March 20, 2009


CARE ABOUNDS IN COMMUNITIES: Thrivent Financial members receive financial support and other resources for volunteer projects and/or fund-raising activities that benefit individuals, families, local communities or organizations, excluding congregations. Members submit activity/funding requests to their local Thrivent chapter leadership board. In 2009, the Charlotte County Chapter Board will have \$\\$11,212 in matching funds.

CARE IN CONGREGATIONS: Through the Care in Congregations program, Thrivent Financial members receive financial support and other resources for volunteer projects and/or fundraising activities that benefit their Lutheran congregations and related Lutheran institutions. In 2009, Redeemer has received \$1,020 in matching funds.

THE GIVING PLUS PROGRAM: Thrivent Financial benefit members are eligible to participate in the Giving Plus program. This program adds \$1 for every \$2 contributed by a member to an eligible Lutheran organization (not including congregations) up to a maximum of \$300 per organization, per year. For example, one could donate \$600 to Redeemer Lutheran Child Care and Thrivent will donate an additional \$300! In order to receive these matching funds the Giving Plus program form must be submitted. The form is located on the Information desk in the narthex or may be obtained by calling or e-mailing the church office.





Gratitude for God's Blessings, April 2009

"Taxes, Tips, and Tithes"

Many people dread April 15th because it is the deadline for filing 2008 tax returns. Others may not be all that concerned because they had so much withholding tax that they will actually get a refund.



Most Americans would be thrilled if they had to pay only 10% of their income for taxes. But we know better. In many places the state sales tax alone is 8%. Social Security tax is another 7.65% (15.3% if you are a pastor, professional church worker, or others who are considered self-employed for tax purposes). State and federal income taxes are in addition to these other taxes. It doesn't take long to figure out that we are paying "double and triple tithes" for state and federal taxes.

And how about tips when we go out to eat at a nice restaurant? 10% used to be the standard tip, but in most people's minds it has moved up to 15-20%. We may grumble a little about this extra charge, but we pay it.

What happens when our pastor preaches and teaches about a tithe (10% of income) for the support of the Lord's work through the local congregation? Some people view that as an impossible expectation. Others may view that as a good starting point and rejoice that they are able to move beyond the tithe because they want to respond generously from what God has graciously bestowed upon them.

Is giving a tithe of the financial blessings that God has given to us an impossible expectation? For most of us it probably isn't if we practice discipline and good judgment in managing our financial resources. Some have learned to use the 10-10-80 plan. This plan involves giving the first 10% to the Lord, using the next 10% for saving and investing and then learning to live on the remaining 80%. It is not the perfect plan or the only plan, but it is a good one to start with if you find that you have not been disciplined in your handling of money.

Is giving a tithe a command for Christians? No, it isn't, because to make the tithe into a command would make it more like taxes and tips. The big spiritual question about Christian giving is this one: "What percentage of the financial blessings that God has entrusted to me do I believe He is calling me to give?" We do not give in order to meet the church budget, or do our fair share or because someone puts a guilt trip on us. 2 Corinthians 9:7 gives us this wise counsel: "Each one should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful [literally, hilarious] giver."

The key is to talk to God in prayer, asking for His guidance regarding giving, and then moving forward empowered by His Holy Spirit to be free and joyful in our Christian giving.
