REDEEMER LUTHERAN CHURCH - JULY 2010 "EVERYONE LOVES A COMEBACK STORY"

One of the many good things I learned from my father when growing up was his optimism in rooting for the underdog. At first, I thought it was a wise thing to root for the favorite. That way, when they won, I could say I chose the winner. Not so with my father. He explained that cheering for the underdog, the weaker, less skilled athlete or team, is like cheering for a family member. We are members of the underdog family. We are not possessed with exceptional skills. We have to fight and battle for everything in life. So when the underdog wins, when they comeback and overcome the odds, their effort would become inspiration for other everyday, regular people like us. And even if they don't win, you recognize their effort, their sacrifice, because so many times in life we too will face defeat.

In sporting events, nearly everyone picks the favorite, the stronger athlete, the proven winner. It appears to be the wisest decision. We do the same in the business market too. We choose the popular product, the largest companies, and the best deals. Doesn't everyone shop at Wal-Mart? But, what happens when a company goes through a difficult time? Can they, like an athlete, comeback?

What a terrible time to be BP, right? With oil continuing to gush out of one of its oil rigs into the Gulf of Mexico, the London-based company's future looks as murky as the water around the Louisiana and Florida coastline. BP faces losses estimated at more than \$5 billion due to the oil spill. Its brand image, for now, and perhaps forever, is tarnished.

Will BP comeback from this disaster? Is anything good even being spoken about them? Who's rooting them on to success?

It seemed the company had put an earlier explosion behind them. The Department of Justice fined the company \$50 million in 2007 for safety violations at a Houston refinery that exploded in 2005, killing 15 people and injuring 170.

For big companies, coming back from corporate scandal, financial malfeasance or public disaster is difficult, but it isn't impossible

Strong leadership is key to all successful corporate comebacks. For example, Gordon Bethune, a former Boeing executive, led Continental Airlines from 1994 to 2004, nursing the company back to health after it filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection on two separate occasions. At the time the company, which announced in early May of this year, a merger with United Airlines, had been ravaged by regulatory and management problems. Bethune famously created the "Go Forward Plan," rebuilding employee morale, reconstructing consumer trust and returning the company to profitability only two years after bankruptcy

filings.

Another strong leader, Steve Jobs, chief executive officer and co-founder of Apple, was ousted from the company in 1985 after losing trust of the company's board members. Innovation at Apple lagged in the years that followed. Sales dropped 18 percent, on average, for three years



from 1995 to 1998. Job's return to the California Company in 1997 helped rectify Apple, which went on to revolutionize the digital music and mobile phone industries.

Other keys to a successful comeback are swift action and communication. Advertising can also play a role in helping companies rebuild trust. Of course advertising alone can't repair a company's reputation, but advertising does well when credibility has been re-established.

Recently here at Redeemer Lutheran Church, there have been many resignations submitted from members of the Church Council. (Please read our 'new' President's newsletter article). This activity can easily cause anxiety and distress among the membership of the congregation. By appearance alone, it seems Redeemer is failing or that some sort of scandal has taken place to cause such a stir. Some want to point fingers and cast blame. Others want to support the work and mission of the church. What's the right decision? Support the underdog, the church family.

We were all made members of God's family by the water and the Word in Holy Baptism. We all believe and profess our faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

We are instructed by God's Word to "encourage one another and build one another up" (1 Thessalonians 5:11). Like a coach will encourage an athlete during training or an employer build up his employees to perform their duties, so we should support the church and her servants.

We must be careful though that while we build up, we are not to tear down. In Luther's explanation of the 8th Commandment, he writes, "we should not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but we are to defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way" (*Small Catechism* pp. 87). God requires that we should speak up for and protect our neighbor from false accu-

BIBLE FACTS

The bible contains 1,189 chapters. The old testament has 929 chapters and the new testament has 260. The shortest chapter is Psalm 117, the longest is Psalm119. The very center of the bible is Psalm 118, verse 14, "The Lord is my strength and my song and He has become my salvation". So, we can learn that Christ is the center of the bible and therefore He should be the center of our life. The word bible comes from the word *biblia* meaning "books". The bible has been written in three languages, originally. The old testament was written in Hebrew, with the exception of Daniel which is written in Aramaic. The new testament was written in Greek.

CHRISTIAN SUPPORT GROUP

The Support Group meets on the last Wednesday of the month at 10:00 am in the Quiet Room, off the Narthex of the church. Members and friends are invited to attend.

At the meeting of May 26, the first scripture lesson was from the Revised Standard Version - Psalm 56: 8 - Thou has kept count of my tossings: put thou my tears in thy bottle. Are they not in thy book?

The second scripture lesson was - Luke 7: 36-50 – Now one of the Pharisees invited Jesus to have dinner with him, so he went to the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. When a woman who had lived a sinful life in that town learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, she brought an alabaster jar of perfume, and as she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with hear tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them.

Tears are mentioned frequently in the Bible. The tear bottle is mentioned only once though perhaps it is alluded to in a number of other passages. The experiences which were recorded in the Psalms were difficult for David and his prayers and tears were numerous. David's desperation was very evident. He cried to God in his difficult time, and his prayer was accompanied by tears. Such experiences are not uncommon to God's people today. The Christian's prayers can bring tears — actual tears as well as inner tears of agony.

Sorrow, suffering and tears are a result of sin. After man firs sinned in the Garden of Eden, God promised to both that sorrow would be a part of human life. To ever, He said, "In sorrow thou shall bring forth children" To Adam He said, "in sorrow shall thou eat of the ground, all the days of they life."

The expression "put thou my tears into thy bottle" seems unusual to us. In Persia, and in Egypt, tears were wiped from the cheeks and the eyes of the mourners and were stored in a tar bottle, where they were carefully preserved. Thy believed that tears would prove to God that the person had been righteous during his lifetime and that God would mercifully reward him. That such a belief existed seems to be substantiated by the fact that the individual's tear bottle was buried with him at death. Tear bottles have been found in many of the ancient tombs of Egypt and elsewhere throughout the East. These bottles were made of alabaster/, since glass was not yet in use.

During his imprisonment among the Philistines David did not have a tear bottle of his own. Thus, he asked the Lord to store his tears and to record them in His divine record book. He was praying that God would record his sufferings and sorrow and that He would not forget his tears. One is reminded of God's statement to Moses regarding the sufferings of His people in ancient Egypt.

The story of Luke has often puzzled Bible readers. While Jesus ate at Simon's home, (one of the Pharisees) a woman stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash His feet with tears, and

she wiped them with hairs of her heard, and kissed His feet and anointed them with the ointment. How could a woman shed enough tears to wash a person's feet?

It is possible that the woman brought her bottle of tears to Jesus. These tears, saved during her lifetime, were the symbol of her sorrow. She washed Christ's feet with her tears, an act which was meaningful tot eh women and also to Jesus. She gave her most precious items, her tears and the box of costly ointment, or perfume to Christ. Instead of keeping thee treasures until she died, this woman poured them out on Jesus as tokens of her love and gratitude for His mercy.

It will be wonderful when "God shall wipe away all tears", from the eyes of the redeemed people. Then we will live eternally in His presence, where there "shall be no more death, sorrow or crying – neither shall there be any more pain". (Rev. 21:4)

Tears and tear bottles will be discarded forever.

We discussed the lessons, then situations that had occurred during the last month regarding friends and ourselves. We ended with the "Lord's Prayer" and a prayer for our members who were present and for those that were absent.




